The Eden Mill Nature Center received a 2012 mini-grant to start their Bee Aware educational program last summer. The new program was geared to teaching school-age children about pollination and sustainable agriculture. Eden Mill used the grant money to purchase the initial equipment needed for the summer program, which has since expanded and been incorporated into field trips and other year-round activities.
