# FUND TYPES

*The Community Foundation of Harford County holds different types of funds depending on the instructions and intentions of the donor who created the fund.*

Endowed	Non-Endowed
is a fund where the initial gift and subsequent gifts are generally never spent, with a portion of the fund supporting the charitable purpose defined by the fund's founding donor.	is a fund where all gifts as well as the investment return are used for the charitable intent.

## Endowed and Non-Endowed Funds fall into the following categories:

<p><b>Donor-Advised</b></p> <p>funds allow the donor to maintain an advisory role in grant-making.</p>	<p><b>Scholarship funds</b></p> <p>allow a donor to provide financial assistance for academic need.</p>
<p><b>Designated</b></p> <p>funds allow a donor to designate one or more specific nonprofits to be supported each year.</p>	<p><b>Unrestricted</b></p> <p>funds allow a donor to direct the Community Foundation to determine the most appropriate uses for the fund, responding to the community's greatest needs at the time.</p>
<p><b>Field of Interest</b></p> <p>funds allow a donor to specify general areas to direct grantmaking, but not specific nonprofits.</p>	<p><b>Agency</b></p> <p>funds allow nonprofits to work with the Community Foundation to take advantage of its expertise in managing charitable funds.</p>
